Welcome to the Mulberry Tree Café

We are located at historic Strelley Hall in Strelley village, this period building dates back to medieval times. The Strelley Hall site provides office space for businesses and offers the large and elegant main rooms in the Hall for hire for functions such as meetings, parties and funeral wakes. The building housing the Mulberry Tree Café was built as stables around 1800.

Our newest addition to the site is our very own Mulberry Tree Bakehouse, for freshly-baked artisan bread, pastries, savouries and takeaway drinks; open Thursday through to Sunday 10am-3pm.

Whilst you are here, do visit the shops in the Stables Courtyard which sell a range of gifts, crafts, home and garden items, old fashioned sweets; plus a teddy repair shop and the Hayloft Gallery for art, photography and picture framing.

The grounds of Strelley Hall are open for you to wander around, there are plenty of seating areas and a swing for children near to the main reception driveway. We have a booklet on sale in the café which gives some information on the history of Strelley Hall plus some details of local walks in the area.

The Mulberry Tree Café takes its name from the ancient fruit tree in the grounds. Our food is homemade using local produce or local supplier where possible, and of course our own Bakehouse for the cakes and bread.
